Each nation is represented by a tableaux wagon with native costumes and characterizations. Great Britian, Belgium, France, United States, China, Germany, and a vast number of others, are all on display with all the glory that goldleaf and tinsel as well as artistic arrangement can provide. The wagons are the height of artistic endeavor, cost and fortune. They are beautifully carved in wood and the designs were patterned by European artists.

Then there are bands galore, calliopes appealing to the multitude while clowns furnish the fun. The animal part of the parade includes elephants caprisoned in oriental blankets with their trappings, camels guarded by Arabian caretakers, cages having the lions, polar bears and many others all in the open, so all can see them. The horses in the parade are the finest in the country. They appear in teams of eight and six with their gilded harnesses and brilliant settings make a sight which is particularly appealing to all.
